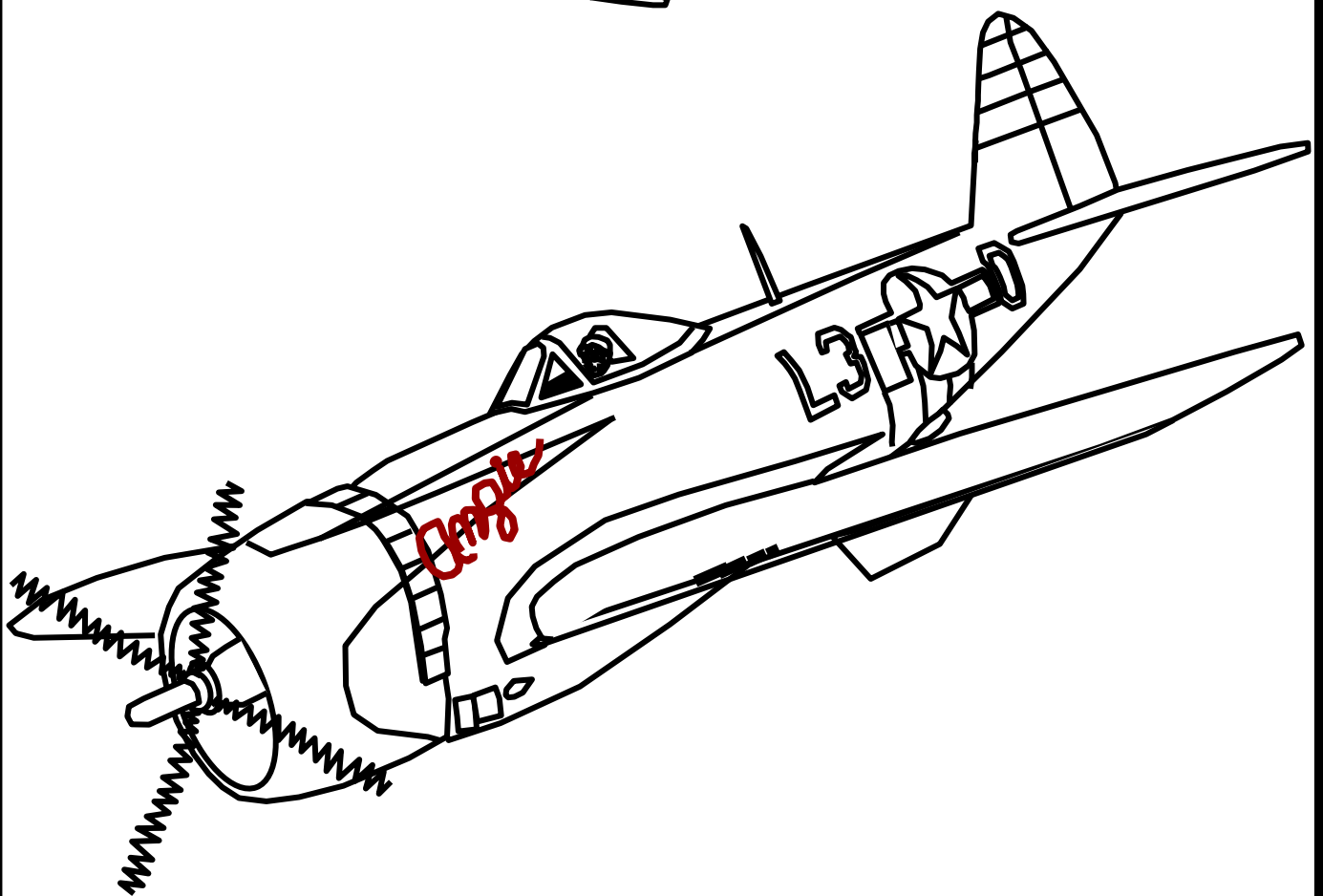
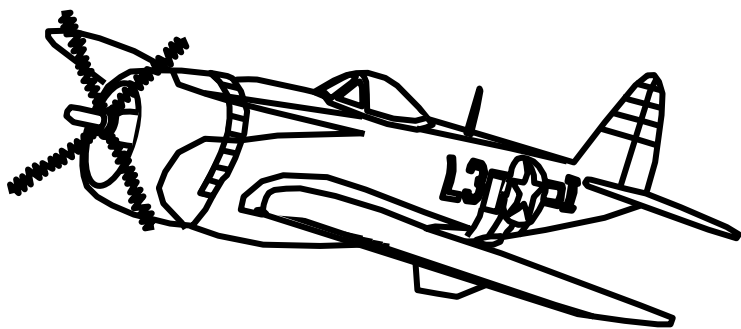
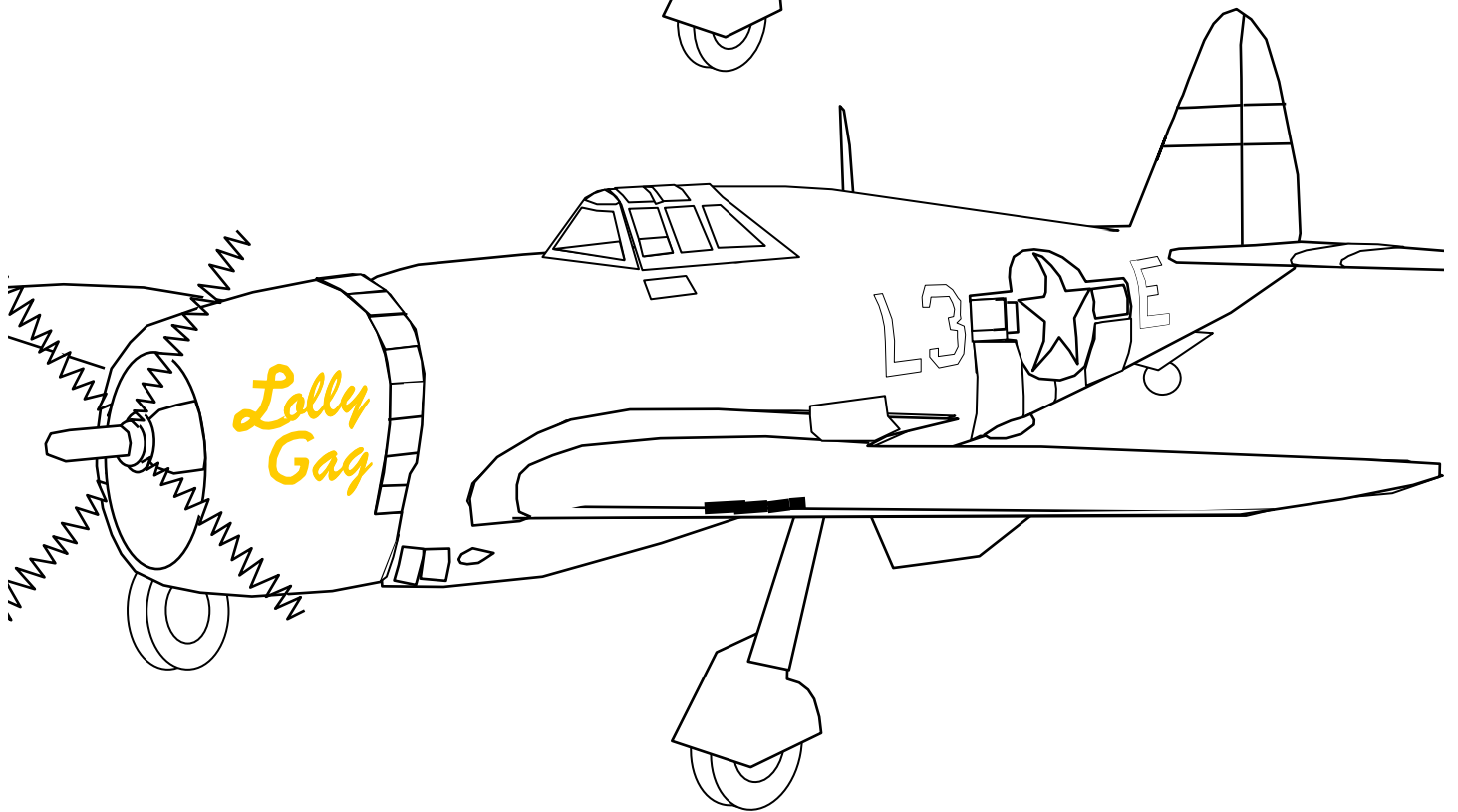
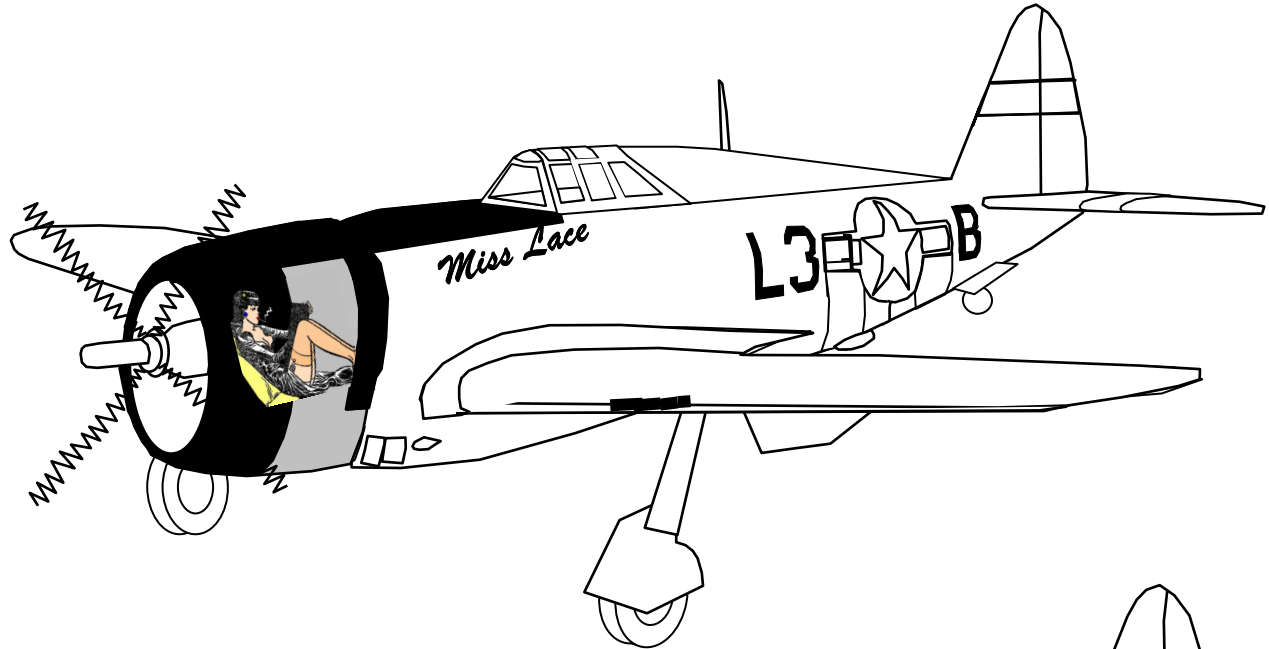
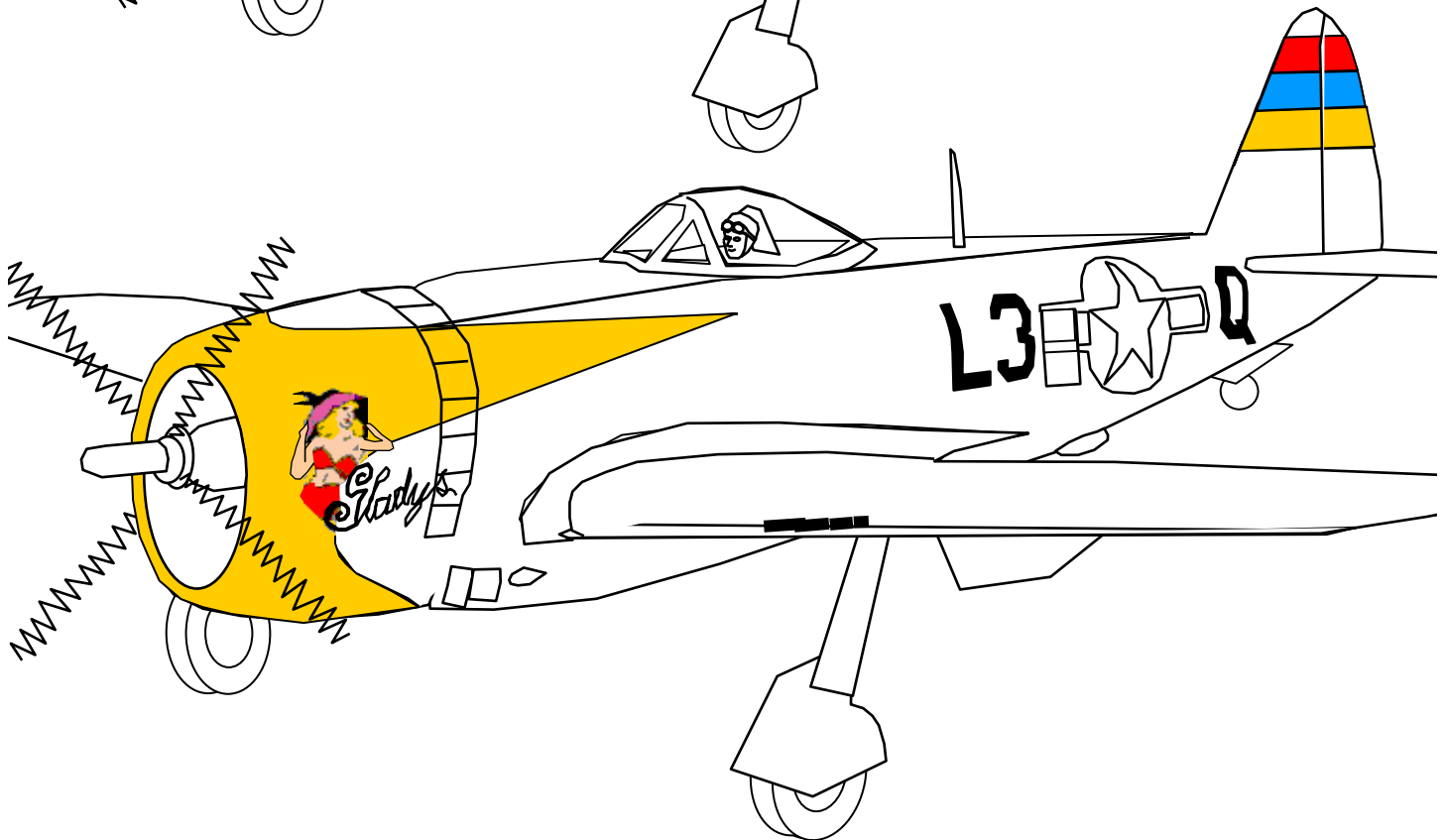
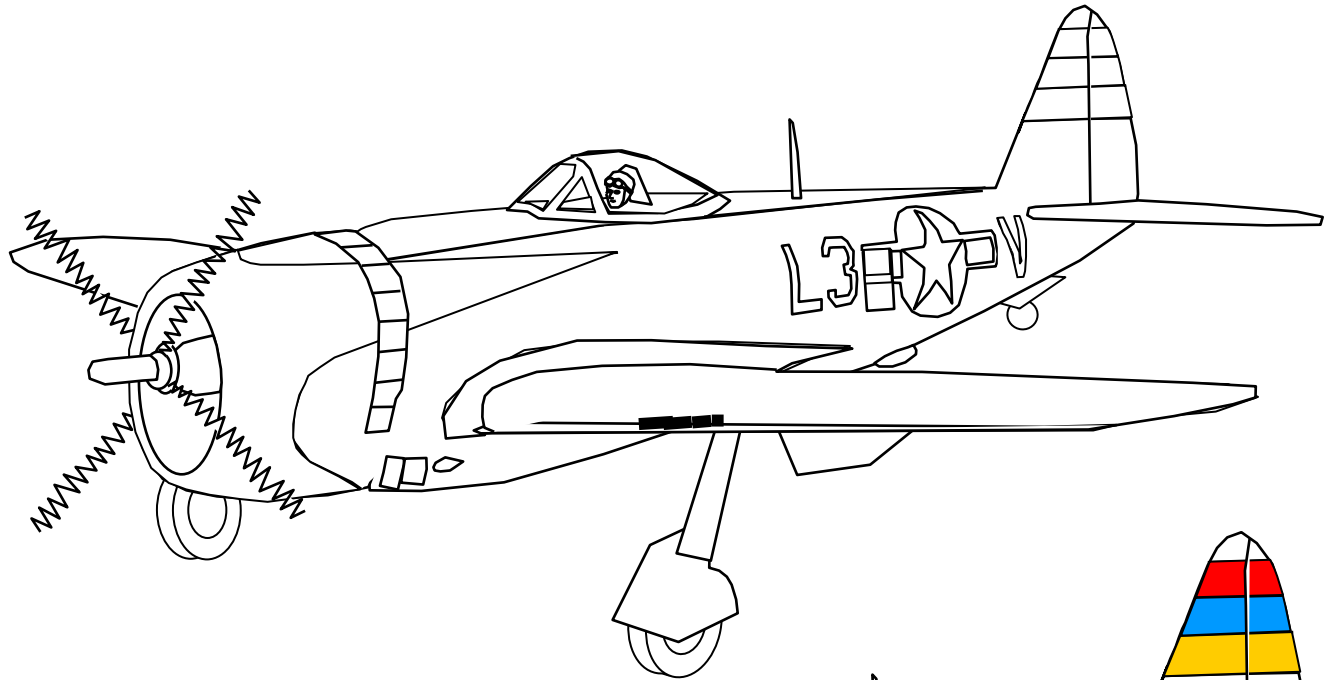


# 512<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron Coloring Book

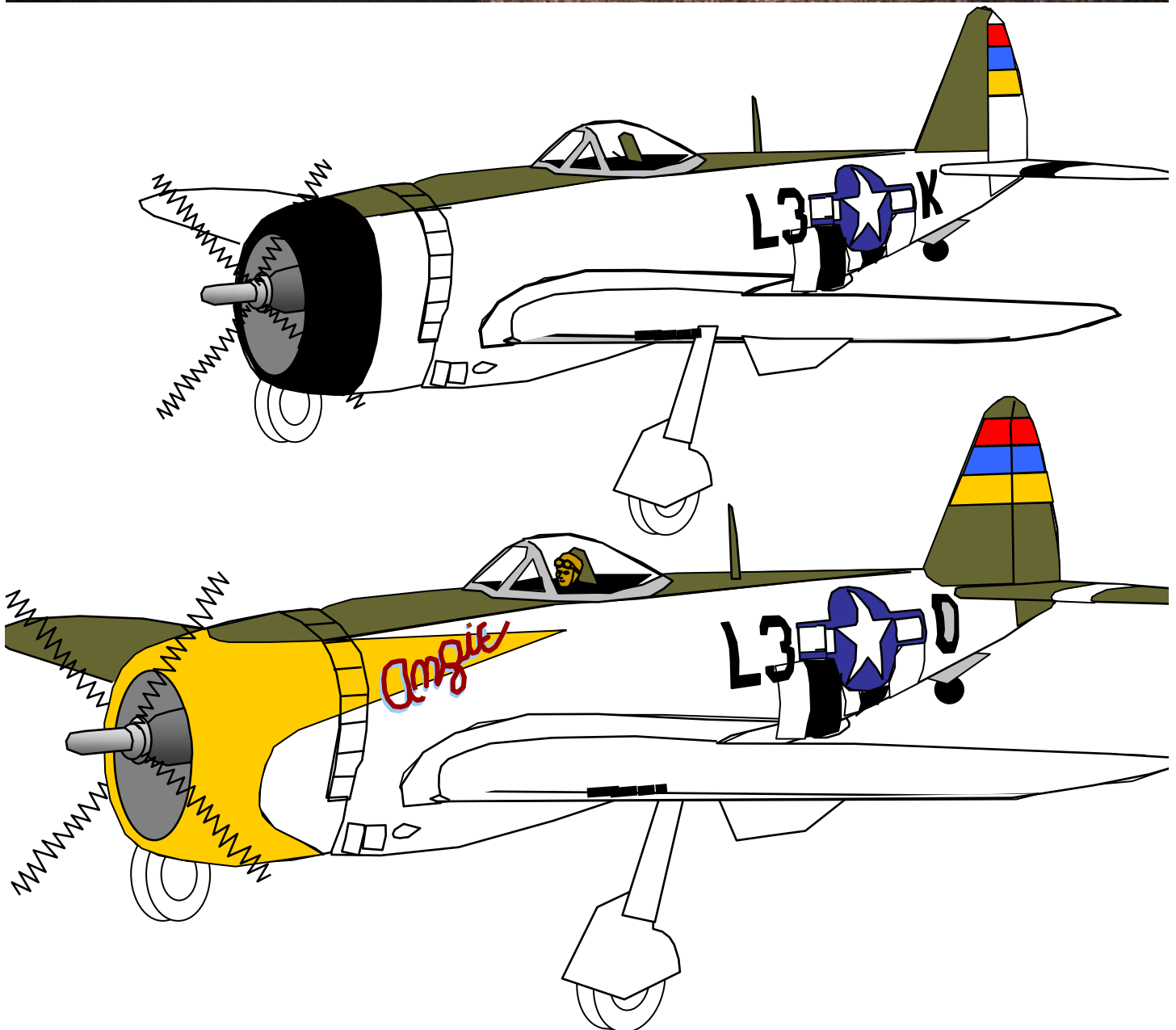




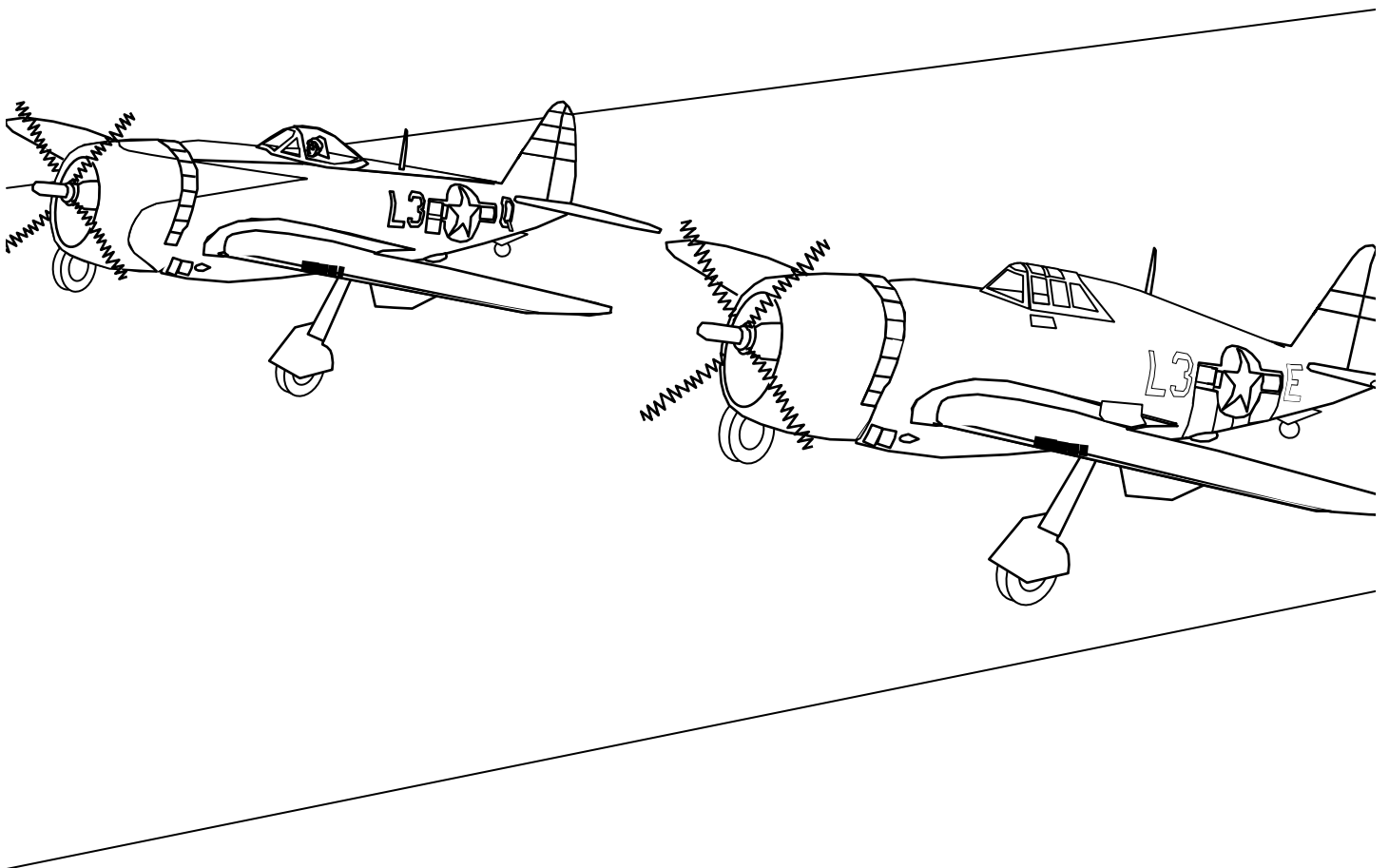

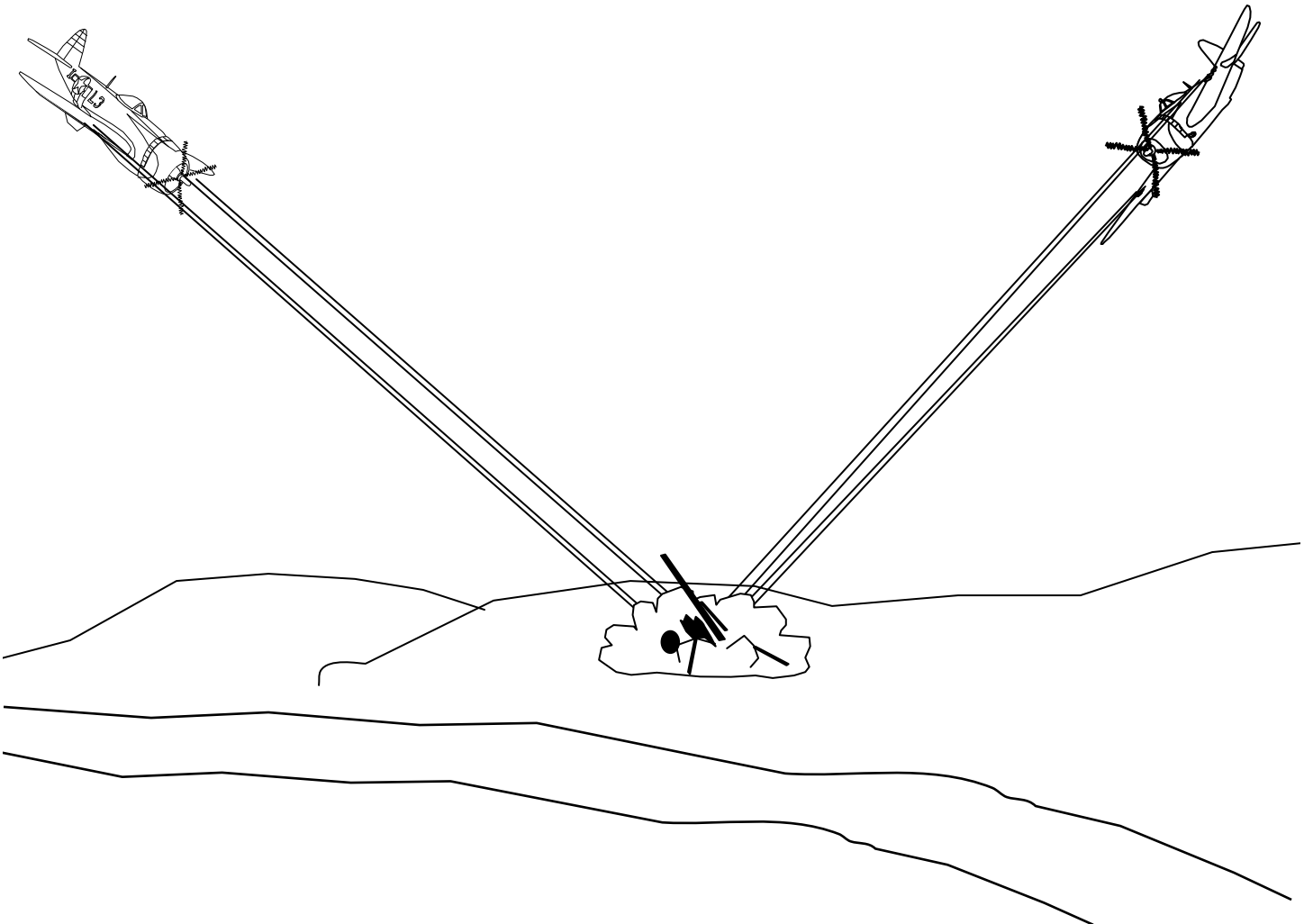
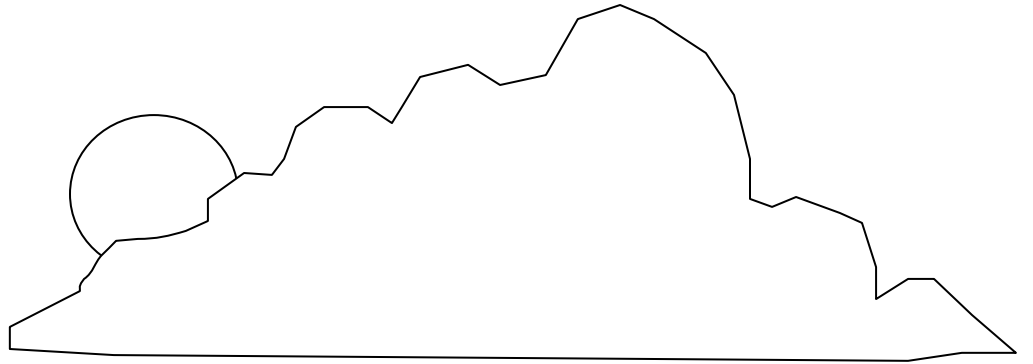
And the Squadron had some shiny new Thunderbolts, like L3-V and "Gladys"



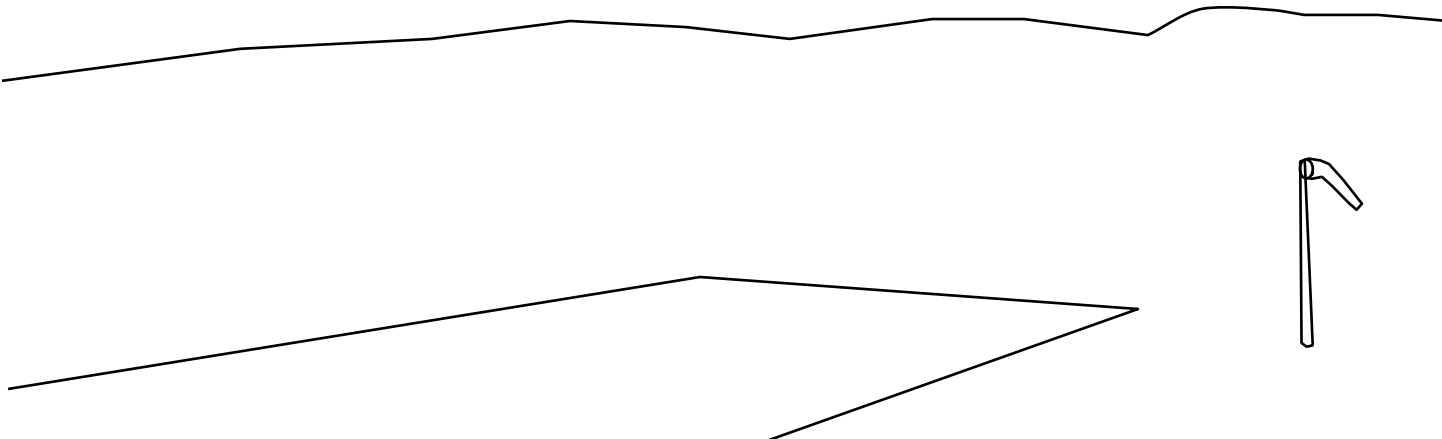
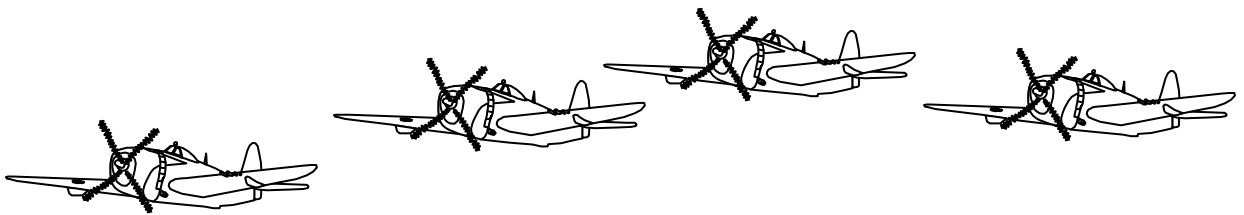
But most of the Squadron's Thunderbolts were rather new but still looked like they had been fighting a war for 6 months...and that's exactly what they had been doing!



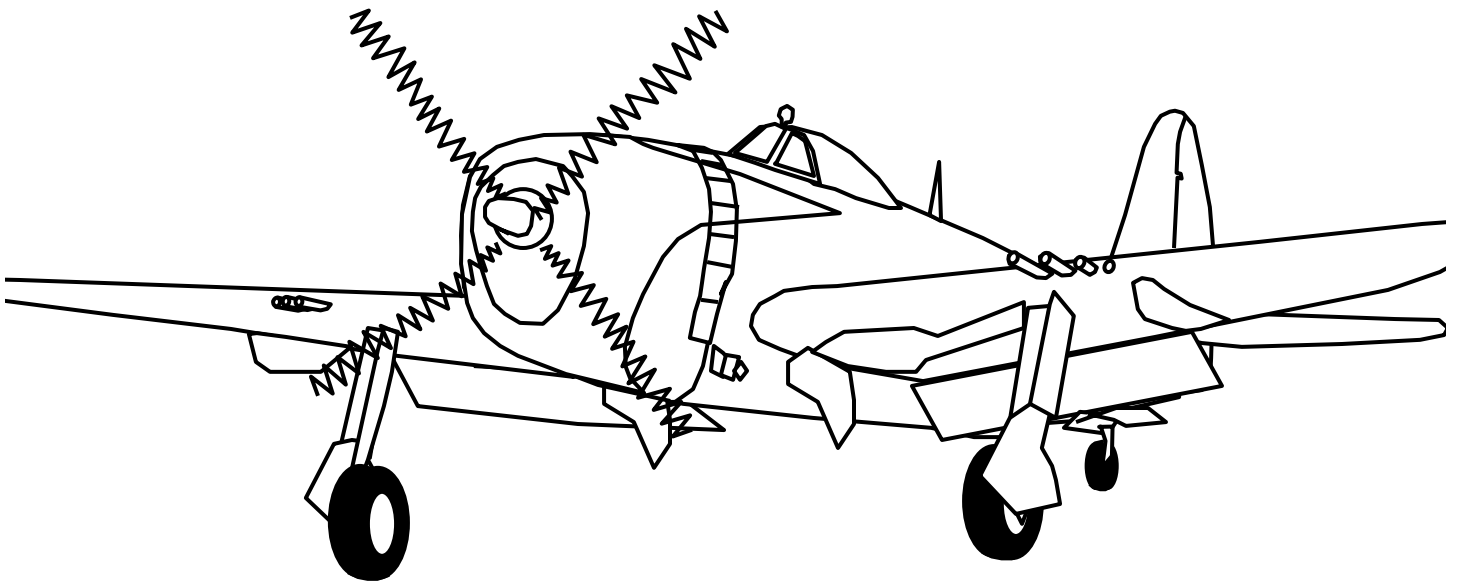
The Squadron's Thunderbolts usually took off in pairs called elements.



Sometimes the two Thunderbolts in an element would attack the same target from two different directions at the same time



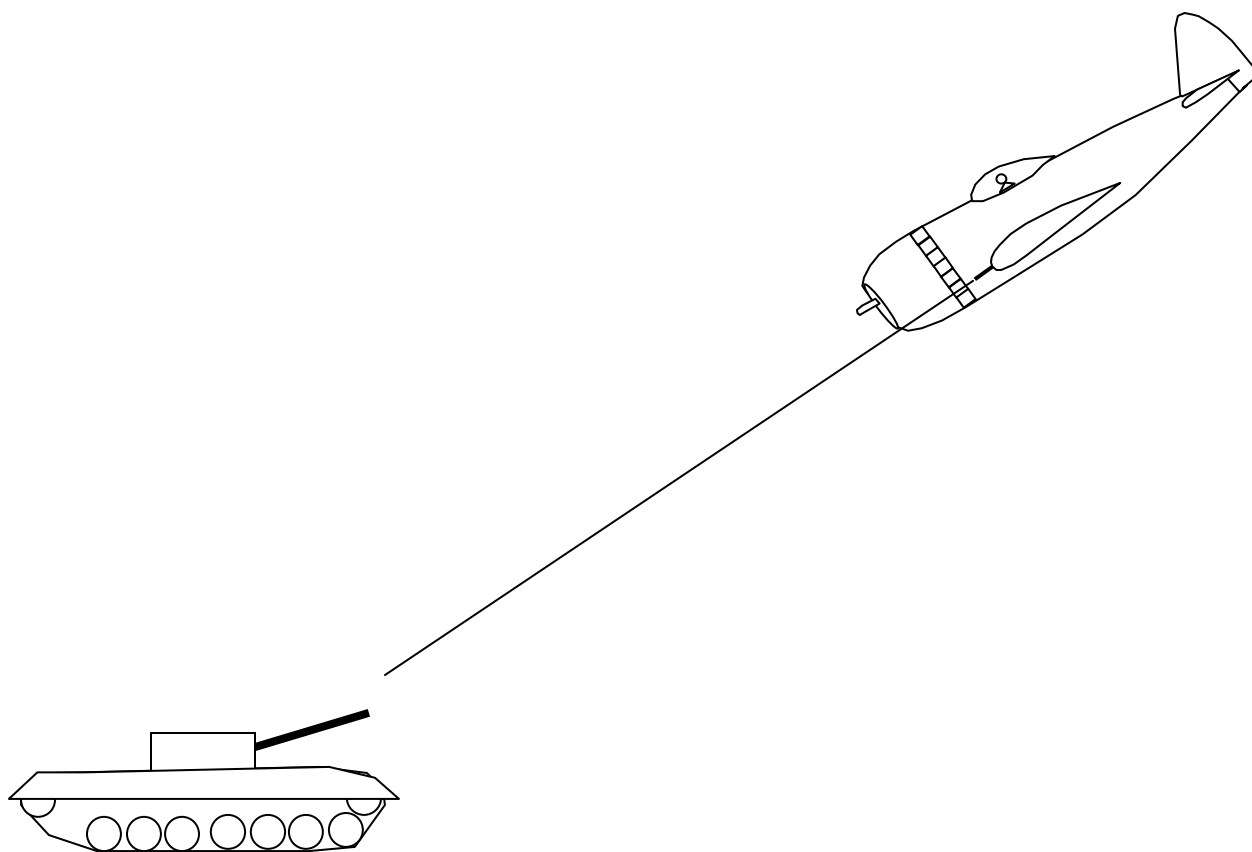
When Thunderbolts got ready to land, they would fly over the airfield in groups of 4.
